

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# Liberia Dujar High School



The Corona Virus has had a disruption to school activities in Liberia In the last two years. Because of the virus, activities in schools throughout Liberia were shortened. Instead of the regular 10 months, they were reduced to between seven to eight months.

But through concerted efforts and adequate measures put in place by the Government of Liberia, the situation was handled properly. This paved the way for the Government through the Ministry of Education to regularize school activities to the 10 months as was the case prior to the outbreak of Covid-19. It was therefore announced in April of the year that schools closed in July of this year and reopened in September 2022.

With this announcement, Schools throughout the country set the tone for the reopening of schools. But opening in September in honest wasn't realistic given. Therefore, all schools began in October.

A two-day workshop was held in the last week of September for the teachers to help upgrade them in various teaching methods needed to carry out effective teaching at the school.

#### Students Enrollment:

Given the financial situation that has engulfed the nation because of Covid-19 and now the Ukrainian crisis, registration at the school began at a very slow pace as parents could not strike the balance financially. However, classes began as scheduled with the students registered and the process remaining opened up to the end of October. To this date, the enrollment stands at 725 registered students. Of this number, 400 are girls and 325 boys.

The first marking period has just been concluded and grade sheets are expected to be given by the 5th of December so that parents and students know the progress made.



#### **Teachers Honoured**



As it is well known worldwide, teachers are the bed rock of any country. Due to their importance, the United Nations decided to set aside October 5th as Teachers Day.

Liberia Dujar Association in the conjunction with the administration of the school decided to honour teachers working with Liberia Dujar High School on November 25 on the campus of the school. The program which should have been on October 5th as recognized by the UN was put forward due to the late opening of school. However, on Friday November 25, the program which brought together students, parents and the Representative of the district in which the school is operated was held.

Stressing the importance of teachers, the Project Director of Liberia Dujar Association Dennis Toe, thanked the teachers for the sacrifices made throughout the years with their dedication to mould the minds of students. Mr. Toe admitted that teachers are

underpaid in our society but yet they remained dedicated and committed to providing services to students.

However, he noted that by recognizing the teachers, it was a way of giving them their flowers while they were still alive. He promised with time, improvement will be made to both their financial and social status.

In response, the head of the teacher's union Hamaralus Samson thanked LDA and the school administration for the recognition which he said was the first of its kind at the school and the community. He said, though there were challenges they are faced with as teachers, the recognition was appreciated and pray for better improvement in years to come so that they can have a sense of belonging.



The 40 teachers were each given a certificate in recognition of their tireless efforts in the school.

# Ännu en container till Liberia!

Trots svårigheterna med finansiering måste andra behov i skolorna uppfyllas.

De flesta regeringsskolorna har det svårt med skolbänkar och annan skolmateriel. Även Liberias Universitetet har det svårt med skolbänkar till alla eleverna.

Liberia Dujar Association vill ha en trivsam skola där det finns bänkar till all eleverna. Under många år har vi skickat skolbänkar, skrivtavlor och annan skolmateriel som vi fått från olika skolor.

De senaste åren har vi fått skolmaterial från Finspång genom Anna Hellerstedt och Fittjaskolan genom Åsa Wännström.

Vår Liberia Dujar High School har brist på matsalsmöbler. Detta bidrar till att eleverna står lutade mot väggen, när de äter sin lunch. De över 15 år gamla bänkarna av inhemsk tillverkning har gått sönder och behöver ersättas.

#### Database

The school administration though with some technical glitches is working assiduously to digitalise the entire school system for easy access to information. Given the level of work being carried out and the expected signing of an agreement with an internet provider soon, the School is to go digital by the end of December, 2022.

- LDA High School har idag över 700 elever. Alla har inte sittplats i matsalen. Skolan räknar med att ännu fler elever kan tillkomma. Då behövs ännu fler bänkar. De fina svenska skolmöblerna frestar många elever att söka till LDA-skolan;
- LDA fyller 30 år efter jul och nyår. Med de nya möblerna kommer det bidra till flera elever.

Mrs. Shamue's dedication was described to the extent that neither sunshine, rain fall, or getting hurt from falling from the motorbike could stop her from attending and teaching her class. She was beautifully decorated with flowers for her services.

Whatever job she was doing for the upkeep of Victoria has been withdrawn from her due to the ailment. She has also passed away leaving Victoria become an orphan.

The situation has left Victoria wailing once she sees friends of her age going to school every day. A good Samaritan who stepped in to be of help also lost her job quite recently after enrolling her. She seems determined to learn but she was not sure what would become of her once the time reached for the collection of fees by the school.

Victoria was undecided on what she wants to be in the future. But for now she is curious about learning. She had hope that someone would help her to realize her dream to become someone important in the society.

Surely enough, Jolanta and her daughter Natalia Tellström has given Victoria the chance to realize her dream. They have become her new supporters. They have been supporting students in the Liberia Dujar High School for 25 years.

This is Marie P. Quaye, an 11 Grade student at Liberia Dujar High School. Marie is 19 years old and is an orphan who lost her parents at 16 years. Since then she has been living periodically with guardians either from the maternal or paternal side.

However, things from either side were not good for Marie. She would miss out on school for some days which hinders her progress. Again, her maternal aunty decided to step in two years ago. But again, fate struck her, and her aunt couldn't continue to support her.

Marie couldn't meet up with the demands from the school leaving her to do things on her own. She struggled and passed to the 11th grade through doing housework, cleaning, washing and other chores to raise the school fees.

Marie fought hard to enroll this academic year but is afraid that being an 11 grader she cannot continue the different housework she has been doing over the years as she needs all the time for study. She may not end the school year if she does not get the needed support to finish high school.

Marie's ambition is to become a professional nurse and would like to enroll in the Liberia Dujar Nursing School after completing the Liberia Dujar High School.

But she noted her dreams are hitting hard rocks already with the lack of support as she narrated her story in tears. In spite of the bleakness of her situation, Marie remains hopeful to pursue her ambition.

Is anyone out there to take Marie on your budget? Her school fees are \$270 USD per term or \$540 USD per year.
